Verona's historic center is just a few kilometers away, where nature, history, and culture permeate every corner.






Why is biodiversity essential?

Biodiversity in Verona and its province


The province of Verona is a veritable treasure trove of landscapes and biodiversity. From the mountains of Lessinia and Monte Baldo, with their forests and pastures, to the rolling hills covered in vineyards that produce world-famous wines, to the vast plains dotted with cultivated fields, each landscape tells a different story. And then there's Lake Garda, with its mild climate that nourishes lush Mediterranean vegetation: silvery olive trees, fragrant lemon trees, elegant cypresses, and aromatic plants that fill the air with intense aromas.



Between nature and culture

The landscape of Castel d'Azzano is dominated by cultivated fields, the result of the area's strong agricultural vocation (cereals, vegetables, fodder), but it also preserves green areas and historic gardens linked to villas and rural courtyards.

Similarly, in the center of Verona, historical elements and urban biodiversity merge, especially those linked to green spaces, trees, hedges, and waterways.



Urban biodiversity


The Adige River, which flows through Verona, represents a key ecological corridor in the city, connecting natural and urban environments. Trees such as alders, poplars, and willows along its banks stabilize the soil and provide habitats for birds, amphibians, insects, and small mammals.

In the heart of the city is the Giusti Garden, a small urban ecosystem of great biodiversity importance. It features centuries-old trees such as cypresses, holm oaks, cedars, and oaks, as well as shrubs and seasonal flowers that support pollinating insects, including bees and butterflies. Climbing plants also encourage the presence of birds and small mammals.



Flora and fauna in Castel D'Azzano

The Castel d'Azzano area, characterized by agricultural plains and urban green spaces, is home to landscapes rich in biodiversity. The cultivated fields grow cereals, vegetables, and fodder, providing habitats for birds such as finches, sparrows, and pheasants, as well as small mammals such as hedgehogs and rabbits. The green spaces, public parks, and urban hedges support ornamental trees, shrubs, and seasonal flowers, offering refuge to pollinating insects and butterflies. Small streams and springs are particularly important, creating riparian environments with willows, alders, and reeds, essential for amphibians, aquatic birds, and insects.







The importance of conservation

Protecting local biodiversity is not only an ethical and environmental duty, but also an opportunity to improve the quality of urban life, make cities more resilient, and promote responsible tourism.
